

#### 1<sup>st</sup> Nov 2017:

The Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) has decided that this year the Vigilance Awareness Week would be observed from  $30^{th}$  October to  $4^{th}$  November, 2017. The theme of the week would be "My Vision-Corruption Free India".

Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week every year is part of a multi-pronged approach of the Commission wherein one of the strategies is to encourage everyone to collectively participate in the prevention of and the fight against corruption and to raise public awareness regarding the existence, causes and gravity of and the threat posed by corruption.

As part of the CBSE norms and the Central Vigilance Commission norms, our Vidyalaya also observed this week. On 1<sup>st</sup> Nov, students of the Vidyalaya took the Integrity Pledge during the morning assembly. They were led by Chi. Jasraj of Class XI Science. All students enthusiastically participated to drive home the point that every citizen should be vigilant and commit to uphold high standards of honesty and integrity at all times and support the fight against corruption.

This science quiz is an event organized and conducted by T.I.M.E. (Triumphant Institute Of Management Education Pvt. Ltd.). Aqua Regia- The Science Quiz has been certified by Guiness World Records as the largest Quiz ever held at one location.

Vidyalaya students from classes VIII, IX and X participated in the preliminary rounds of the quiz held on the 10th of November 2017. Each team comprised of two students. This round consisted of 20 questions to be answered in 20 minutes. The top 5 teams from each participating school would qualify for the city finals of the Aqua Regia Quiz.

# 13<sup>th</sup> Nov 2017: Each one teach one

The problem of quality learning in schools is generally due to the the lack of a platform for instant connectivity and differences in the methodologies followed . Due to various reasons like student-teacher ratio, infrastructure and lack of creative teaching methods, students are

left without proper knowledge and support which may continue into their higher education as well.

LEVEL envisions in mainstreaming educational quality by bridging the gap between the schools. "Each One Teach One" is a special cause organized by LEVEL from the 13<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> of November in order to achieve educational equality amongst students.

In this program, LEVEL would shortlist a few tutors from each grade of a few schools of Hyderabad. The tutors are students who could choose various topics or subjects that they were interested to teach. They could teach students in government schools or in orphanages. The medium of teaching could be online through the LEVEL app or in person.

Six students of Class IX from our Vidyalaya (Chi. Debanshi, Chi. Tejas, Chi. Himabindu, Chi. Arul, Chi. Karthik and Chi. Sreeman) accompanied by one staff member(Krishnakanth Sir) participated in this campaign. They went to Devnar School For The Blind, Mayuri Marg, Begumpet on the 13<sup>th</sup> of November. They mingled with the children and in the process learnt how blessed we are.

#### Visit to Raj Bhavan:

Children from our Vidyalaya got an opportunity to visit Raj Bhavan and meet the esteemed Governer Sri. E.S.L Narasimhan, on the occasion of Childrens' Day. 25 Vidyalaya students of Classes I and II, accompanied with a few Vidyalaya teachers visited Raj Bhavan.

As many as 400 school children drawn from 30 schools in Hyderabad, Secunderabad, Rangareddy and Bhuvanagiri districts gathered at the Raj Bhavan, as part of the Children's Day celebrations. Governor Sri E.S.L. Narasimhan and the Lady Governor Smt. Vimala Narasimhan mingled with the tiny tots and interacted with the school children.



For this occasion, The Prof Jayashankar Telangana State Agricultural University arranged a photo exhibition on the Raj Bhavan premises for the benefit of visiting school children. The children went around the exhibition seeing the various special seed varieties, soil types and nutrients, and natural color preparations of the state, and were exposed to the steps being taken for crop protection. The exhibition also contained exhibits on horticulture varieties of tissue culture plants, aromatic and medicinal plants, kitchen garden, fruit varieties etc. The food pyramid displayed in the horticulture exhibition stood out as a special attraction.

The contributions of former Prime Minister, Sri Manmohan Singh, was also highlighted by the students. They also highlighted the literature and fine arts of the state. Students spoke about painters, and writers, and also about the different industries in the state.

This year the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sanskrit Olympiad at National level was conducted for classes VI to X on the 21st of Nov. A total of 114 students from classes VI to X participated in this exam .


