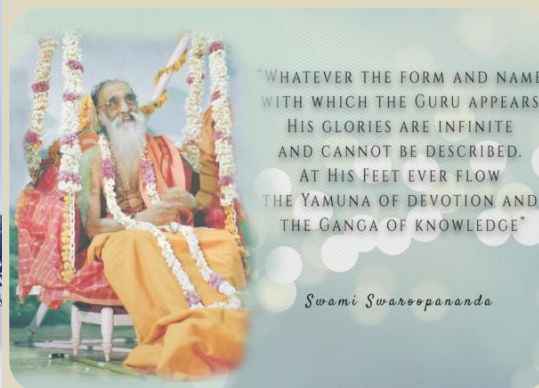
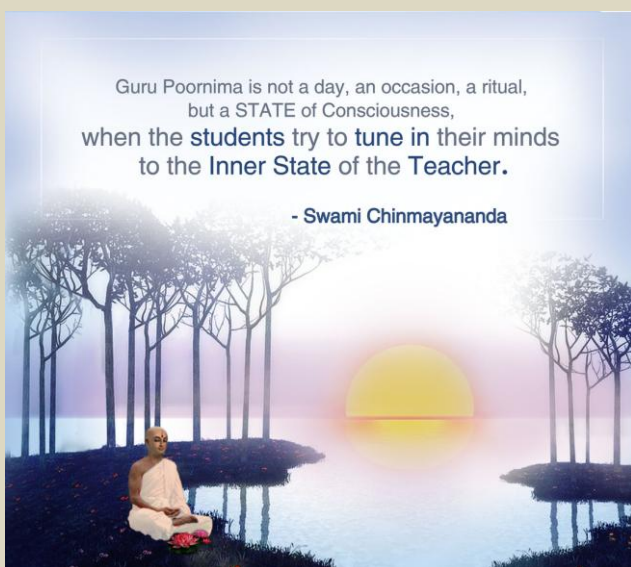

July 4th 2018 to July 10th 2018 : Unit Test 1

Assessment of students for the first few chapters completed in all the subjects for Classes I to IX in the form of Unit test 1 was held from 4th July to 10st July 2018.

July 6th 2018 to July 9th 2018 : WOW

“WOW- Well Being out of Waste” is a program initiated by ITC in collaboration with GHMC with an aim to create awareness amongst the general public about the harmful effects of non-biodegradables wastes and ways to minimize the usage of plastics, glass and similar items.

ITC officials addressed the entire Vidyalaya during the morning assembly on the segregation of waste and the necessity for its proper disposal. WOW has its audience in school children as well, who are easily influenced by novel ideas and who are also equally capable in influencing the elders and people around them. GHMC distributed eco friendly green colour cloth bags to every single child in the Vidyalaya, so that they could get their unused and unwanted stuff for recycling in these bags.

ITC in collaboration with GHMC had set up stalls in the first floor lobby with a plan to exchange old newspapers, books, plastics, and any kind of dry thrash in exchange for notebooks, pens, pencils, erasers, sharpners, scales, crayons, sketchpens and a few more stationary items. This program was spread out over three days, the 6th, 7th and 9th of July. On 6th, Classes I to V children gave away their old stuff, while classes VI to X gave them away on the 7th. Classes XI and XII also exchanged their old stuff on the 7th of July. Any pending exchanges

were done on the 9th of July. All the students who brought the recyclable waste were appreciated with certificates and small gifts.

This had the children running around to gather whatever was there in their houses and their neighbour's houses, in order to give them for recycling. All in all, a wonderful exercise for bringing forth an eco friendly environment around us!!!

July 8th 2018: UGC-NET Examination:

Our Vidyalaya was a centre to conduct the prestigious UGC-NET Examination on 8th July, 2018. A total number of 540 candidates were allotted to our centre by the CBSE and appeared for this competitive exam. Our faculty conducted and invigilated the proceedings of this esteemed examination with extreme diligence.

July 11th 2018: Traffic Awareness Workshop:

Children are an integral part of our Vidyalaya. Their safety is of utmost importance to us. As teachers and care takers inside the Vidyalaya premises, we try our level best for their appropriate safety arrangements.

Senior officials from the Education, Transport , GHMC and RTC departments attended this programme and interacted with the participants.

19th July 2018: Haritha Haram:

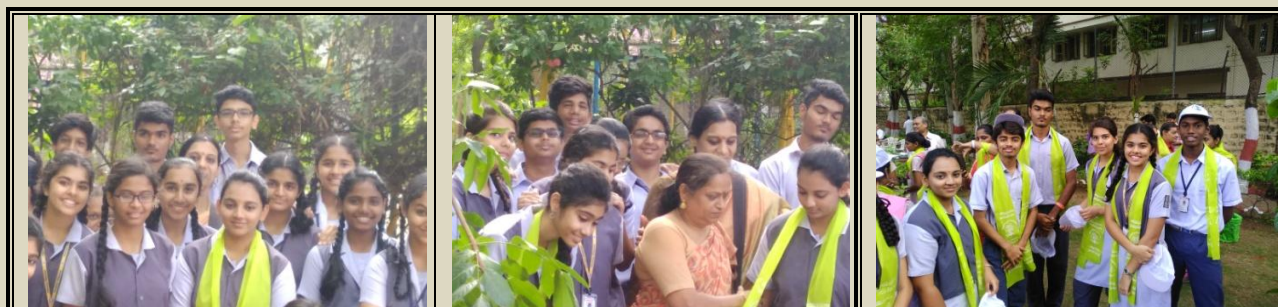

It has been suggested that a few of these students should conduct similar sessions for the other younger students of the Vidyalaya and pass on the message of these traffic police personnel.

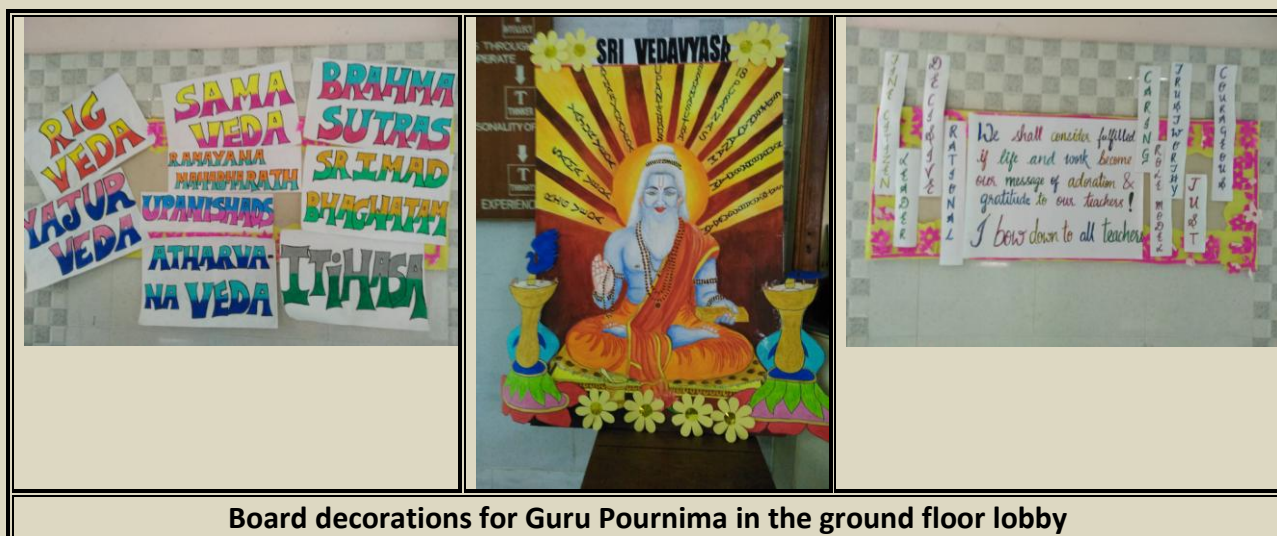
27th July 2018: Guru Pournima Celebrations:

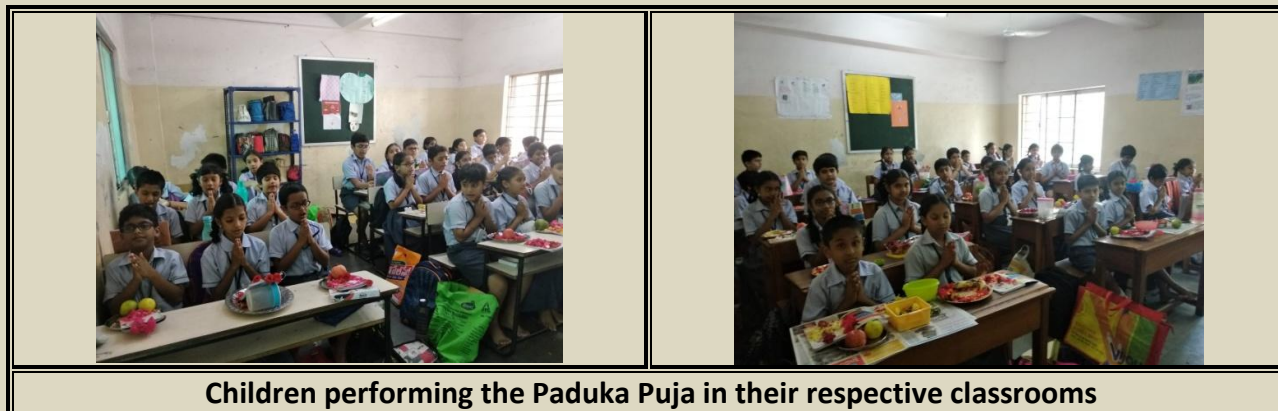

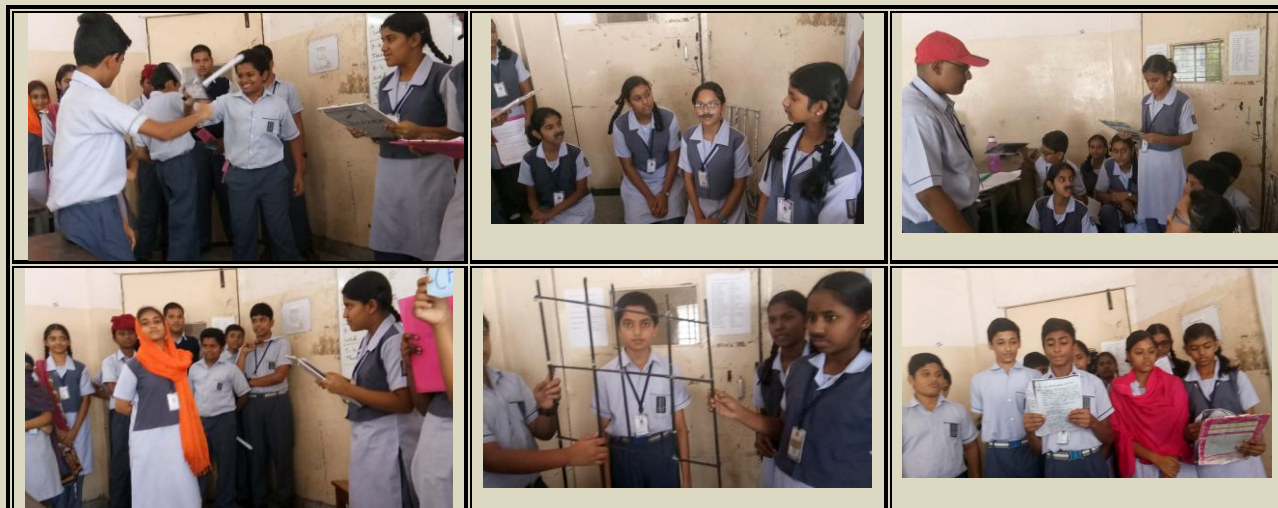

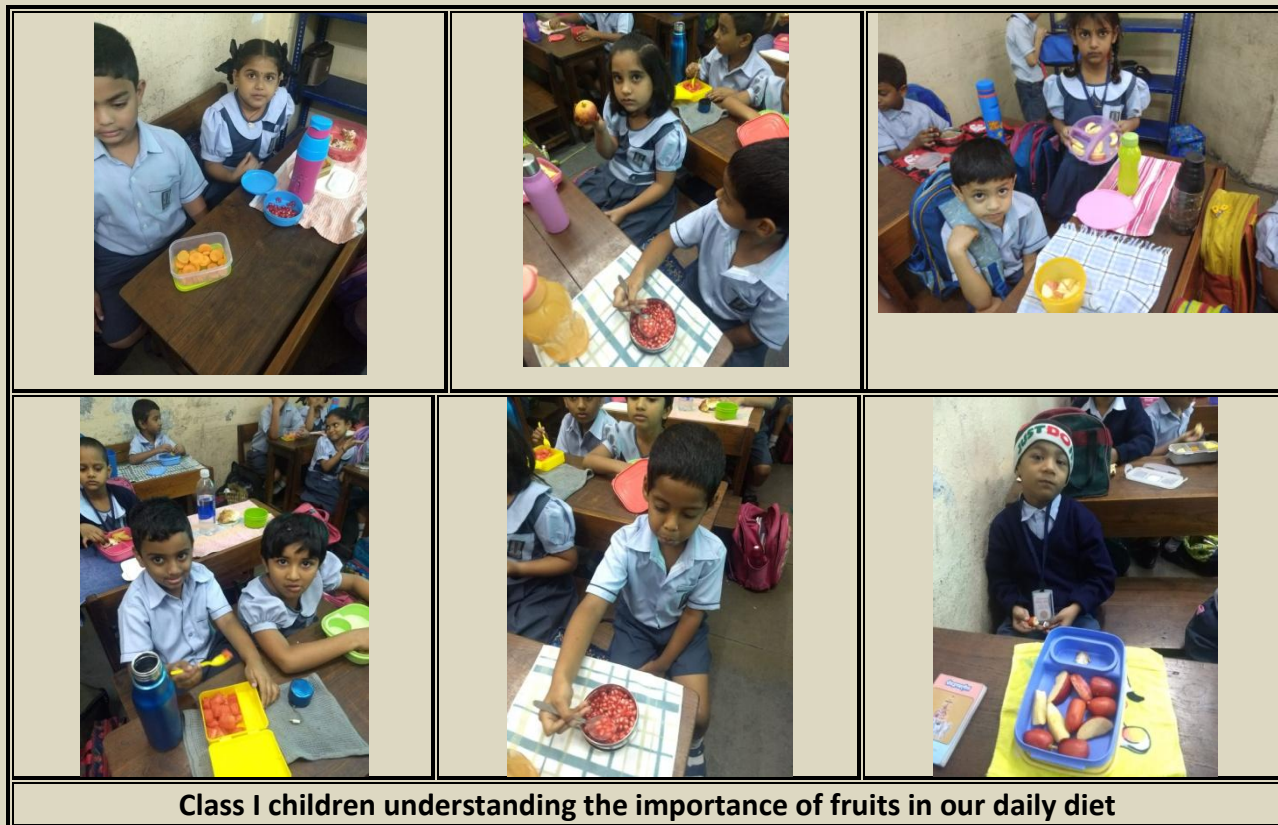


Class VIII students participate in a skit as part of the subject enrichment in English

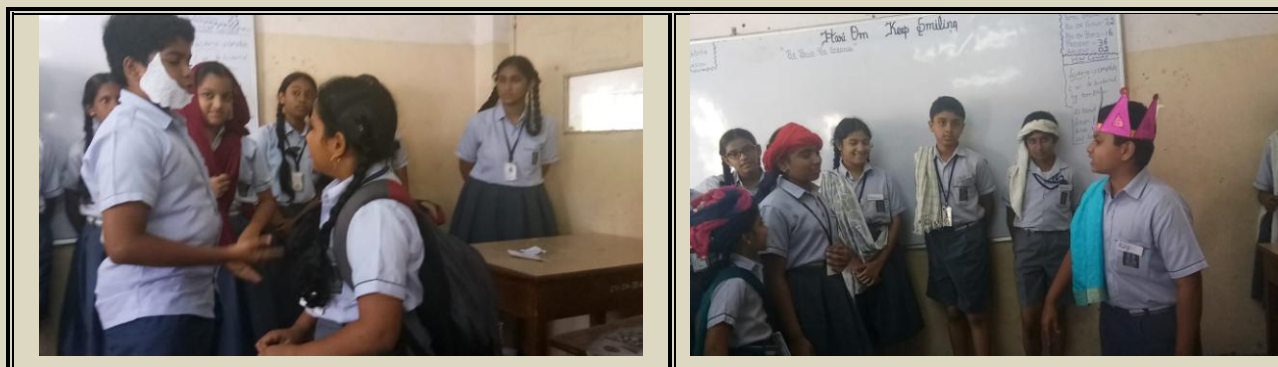




Class I children understanding the importance of fruits in our daily diet

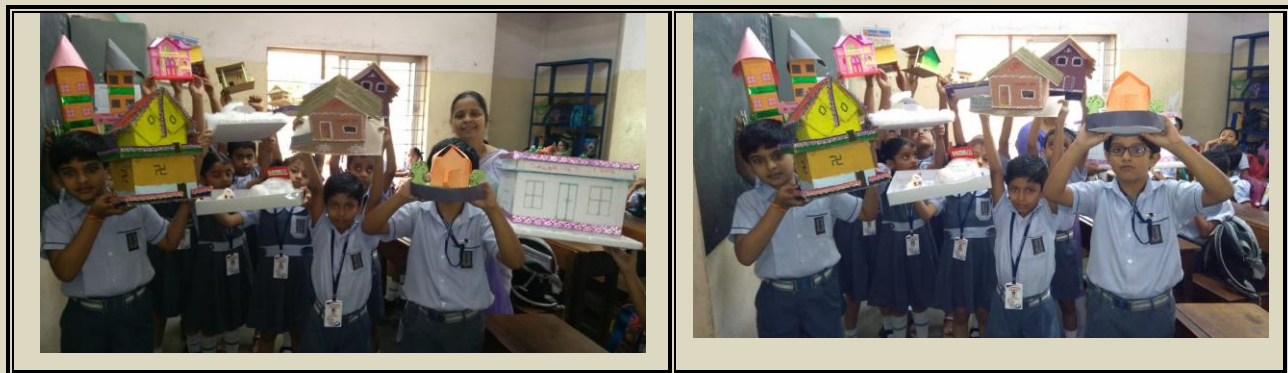
English activity in Class VI:

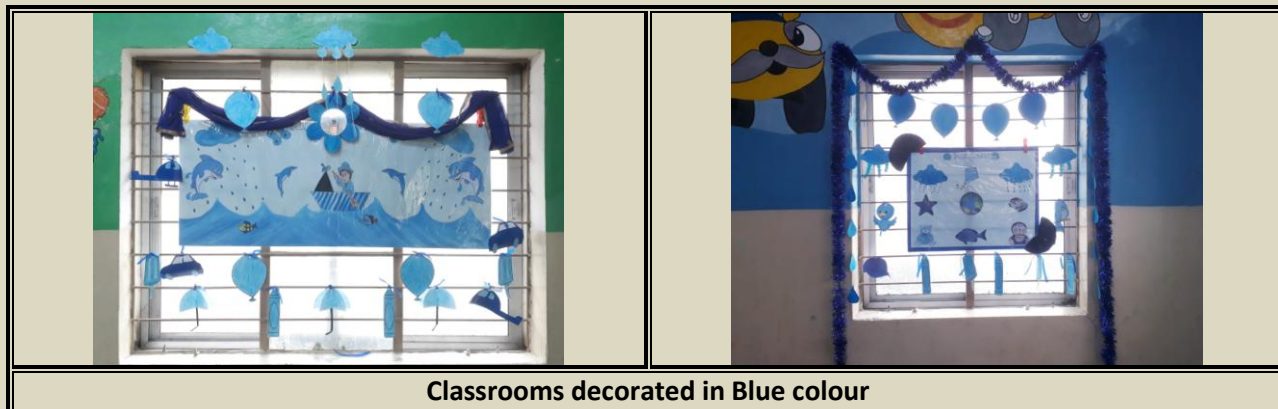


Kindergarten Section:

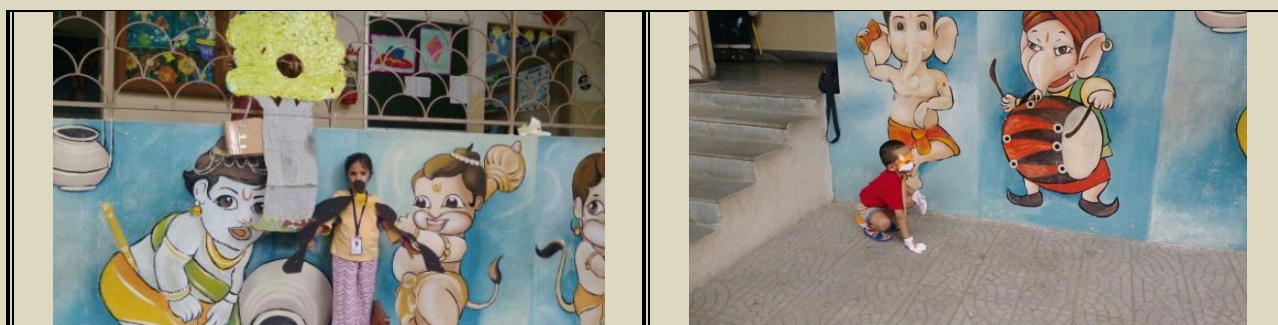


Classrooms decorated in Blue colour

27th July 2018: Enaction of “The thirsty crow”:

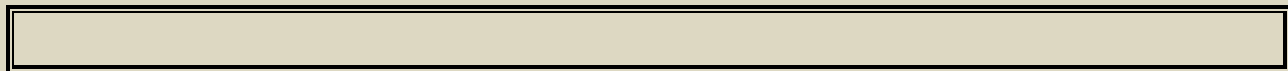
Have you heard the story of the “Thirsty Crow”? Hmmm.....if not, its time to visit the assembly of Kindergarten section and learn about it!!!
